On SUNDAY, 28th OCTOBER, 1956, from 7.0 a.m. to 4.30 p.m., or until the work is completed, the Signal Engineer will be engaged at WORCESTER WYLDS LANE JUNCTION in carrying out the following work:

(a) Bringing into use new Signal:

Form	Description	Position	Distance from Box
O GREEN YELLOW	Down Main Distant. Height 12 feet.	Down Side of Down Main Line.	1,502 yards.

(b) Taking out of use the existing Down Main Semaphore Distant Signal.

The A.T.C. Ramp will be moved to a new position 200 yards to the rear of the new Colour Light Distant Signal.
