SIGNAL ALTERATIONS—

READING (RUSCOMBE)

**SATURDAY 3rd FEBRUARY
TO
TUESDAY 6th FEBRUARY 1973**

Between 22.00 hours on Saturday, 3rd February and 06.00 hours on Tuesday, 6th February, or until completion, the Divisional Signal and Telecommunications Engineer will be engaged in carrying out the following work:—

Removing the existing double junction located at Reading (Ruscombe) and replacing the same by three new high speed crossovers as shown in heavy type on the diagram overleaf. Track circuits will be adjusted accordingly.

The points will be electrically operated by point machines of the Siemens style HB and instructions for their emergency operation have been issued separately.

Occupation of the Control Panel will be required for the purpose of alteration and testing.

All arrangements for the safe working of the line will be made by the nominated person in charge of the possession in accordance with Section 'T' of the Rule Book. Any Handsignalmen required in accordance with Section 'E' of the Rule Book must be appointed by the District Operating Inspector.

During the occupation the signals affected, viz: R6, R77, R106 and R179 will be disconnected and maintained at Danger.
