The Down Main trailing, the compound in the Up Main and the Up Goods trailing connections will be relaid as crossovers in the form shown in heavy type on the diagram overleaf.

The Up Main Inner Home bracket signal and the ground signal backing up the Down Main will be re-positioned 10 yards further from the signal box.

The ground signal backing down the Up Main will be re-positioned 48 yards further from the signal box.

Track circuits will be adjusted accordingly.

Occupation of the locking frame will be required for the purpose of altering and testing the locking.

During the occupation the Distant Signals affected viz Up and Down Mains will be disconnected and maintained at caution.
