The Docks Sidings to Down Main trap point will be recovered and relaid as shown on the attached diagram.

The hand worked facing connection in the Down Reception line to Docks Siding will be recovered.

A new one lever ground frame known as the 'Down Reception Ground Frame' will work points shown X on the attached diagram.

The existing signal B9 will be moved approximately 10 yards further from the Signal Box and will incorporate a new Draw Ahead Signal (B10) routed as shown on the attached diagram.

New stop boards will be provided in the Down Reception adjacent to the new Ground Frame and in Dock Sidings as shown on the attached diagram.

The facing connection from the Down Main to Dock Sidings will be worked by electro-hydraulic clamp locks. Instructions for emergency working as shown in the booklet 'Manual Operation of Power Worked Points' (BR.13108).


