# NOTICE TO DRIVERS, GUARDS, SIGNALMEN AND OTHERS CONCERNED RESPECTING THE WORKING OF RUGELEY 'B' POWER STATION

IMPORTANT: This Notice must be acknowledged IMMEDIATELY on receipt to "TRAINS CREWE" using the code ARNO 32E.

The attached diagram shows the permanent way and signalling in connection with Rugeley 'B' Power Station. The method of working trains through the sidings is indicated on the diagram and Drivers, Guards and others concerned must carry out these instructions.

#### Sunday, 5 April 1970 RUGELEY 'B' POWER STATION

Except during a failure of track circuits and telephones, trains may be propelled or drawn into the sidings via the inlet road.

All movements from the run-round sidings **must** be drawn through the unloading Hoppers.

Local Instructions for working at the Power Station will be detailed in the Sectional Appendix (Southern Section) and will be published in Section 'D' of the Weekly Notice of Engineering Work or the Four Weekly General Instructions and Notices concerned.
