DRIVERS TO KEEP A GOOD LOOK-OUT FOR HAND SIGNALS

New freight and EMU berthing sidings will be brought into use as shown on the diagram herein.

Stop boards will be provided as shown.

Position Light Signal L1305 stencil indications will be amended to show the following:

- F Freight Sidings
- 4 No. 4 Washer Line
- E EMU Berthing Sidings 1-8
- 3 No. 3 Washer Line
- D Down Slow
- " 'B' Section In " line will be renamed "Freight Sidings In/Out".
- " 'B' Section Out " line will be renamed "EMU Berthing Sidings In/Out".

Shunters Releases will be provided for each line.

All other signal indications/application are as existing.



In addition, Members have the opportunity to join signalling related visits to locations on the UK national and London Underground systems; and to other UK Railways.


