#### DRIVERS TO KEEP A GOOD LOOK-OUT FOR HAND SIGNALS

The Signalling and Permanent Way will be introduced in two stages as shown on the diagram herein.

At Hampden Park the Down Starting and Down Inner Home semaphore signals will be replaced by 4 aspect signals numbered CDB 16 and CDB 17 respectively.

- CDB 16 signal will be resited 47 yards closer to Eastbourne and
- CDB 17 signal will be resited 81 yards closer to Polegate than the semaphore signals they replace.
- CDB 2 the Up Outer Home Signal will be moved 456 yards closer to Hampden Park.

Hampden Park Down Platform will be extended by 46 yards at the Eastbourne end and the 8 car stopmark will be positioned at the top of the new platform ramp.
