SIGNAL ALTERATIONS ETC., BETWEEN YATE SOUTH JUNCTION AND WESTERLEIGH WEST

Between the hours of 23.45 on **Saturday, 17th January** and 22.00 on **Sunday, 18th January, 1970**, or until completion, the Chief Signal and Telecommunications Engineer will be engaged in the following work:

Permanent Way Alterations

The existing Up Line from Westerleigh West to Yate South Junction will be re-routed alongside the Down Line.

A new trailing connection will be brought into use from the new Up Line to the single line from Bath Green Park.

This connection will be adjacent to and worked from Yate South Ground Frame.

New Signals and Alterations to existing Signals

The existing Yate South Junction Up Main Home and Distant signals will be recovered.

A new three aspect colour light Up Main Home signal YS17 situated 513 yards from the Signal box will be brought into use.

The Up Branch Starting signal for Westerleigh West will be recovered and replaced by a three aspect colour light signal WW18 also acting as Up Main Distant for Yate South Junction. This signal will be situated 817 yards from Westerleigh West and 1,516 yards from Yate South Junction signal boxes.

Both these new signals will be provided with A.W.S. ramps.

The existing signal UC117R will be converted to a three aspect automatic signal and renamed UC118.

Telephones

Telephone communication will be provided to Yate South Junction from signals UC118 and YS17 and to Westerleigh West from signal WW18.

District Inspector, Yabsley (Bristol) to make all arrangements for the working of the line in accordance with Rule 77 and provide the necessary handsignalmen.
