NOTICE OF SIGNALLING ALTERATIONS ETC.

SECTION "C"

SUNDAY, 1st FEBRUARY. AT BRISTOL TEMPLE MEADS EAST. The remaining portions of the former Up and Down Mangotsfield lines will be taken out of use.

The junction points to and from the Mangotsfield lines will be spiked, clipped and padlocked for the Relief lines and sections of rail will be removed from the Up and Down Mangotsfield lines in lieu of trap points.

The Up Old Station Starting signal will, in future, read to the Up Relief only.

The Down L.M.R. Home and Distant signals will be recovered.

At Lawrence Hill, No. 11 Yard Siding will be extended and realigned to join on to the line from Avonside at the 129 $\frac{1}{4}$ mile post.

A copy of this notice to be issued to all trainmen working over the section of line concerned.
