Position Light Ground Signals J1, J3 and J5 will also in future read to No. 1 Down Reception in addition to their existing routes.

Electric Point Machines are W.B. & S. Co's Style 63 machines, emergency operation instructions for which are issued separately.

Occupation of Newport Panel will be required for the purpose of altering and testing controls.

Chief Signalling Inspector Jones to make all arrangements in accordance with Rule 77.
