Taff Vale Rationalisation Scheme  
Stage III A - Gyfeillon Upper.

Between the hours of 09.00 Saturday, 5th September, and 06.30 Monday, 7th September, or until completion of work, the Chief Signal and Telecommunications Engineer and Divisional Civil Engineer will be carrying out the following work.

The connection from Down Relief to N.C.B. Tymawr Colliery Siding will be recovered and replaced by a new facing connection from Down Main to N.C.B. Tymawr Colliery Siding.

The Down Main Home signal and the Down Relief Home signal will be renewed in the form of a gantry 28 feet in height and 30 yards from the signal box.

Two new elevated discs will be provided situated on the new gantry routed from Down Main to N.C.B. Tymawr Colliery Siding and from Down Relief to N.C.B. Tymawr Colliery Siding.

A new ground disc will be provided on the Up side of the Down Main 179 yards from the signal box on the Cardiff side routed - Backing Down Main to Up Main.

A new ground frame known as Rhondda Cutting Ground Frame will be provided at 13m. 38ch., situated on the down side of Down Main line to work the connection from N.C.B. Tymawr Colliery to Down Main, formally worked by Rhondda Cutting Signal Box, and will be released electrically from Gyfeillon Upper Signal Box. A telephone to Gyfeillon Upper Signal Box will be provided.

District Signalling Inspector, Pontypridd, to make all arrangements for safe working, including the appointment of the necessary Handsignalmen in accordance with Rule 77.
