The existing Connections to the West Loop will be recovered, and new Connections brought into use to give an amended layout as shown on the attached sketch.

UR 7 Signal will be changed from automatic to controlled working and will be renamed 00 121.

Signal 00489 will be repositioned, and have additional routes provided, as shown on the sketch.

Track Circuits will be adjusted accordingly.

All new Connections will be electrically operated by M.V. GRS Type 5A point machines.

Occupation of the Control Panel will be required for the purpose of alteration and testing.

All arrangements for the safe working of the line, together with the appointment of any Handsignalmen required in accordance with Section "E" of the Rule Book, will be made by the District Inspector (Signalling), Old Oak Common.
