NEWPORT - BRITISH STEEL CORPORATION,
SPENCER WORKS, LLANWERN - NEW FOREIGN ORE SIDINGS

Between the hours of 08.00 and 18.00 Sunday, 19 May, 1974, or until work is completed, the D.C.E. and the C.S. & T.E. will be engaged in carrying out the following work:-

New Sidings to be known as the Foreign Ore Sidings, with an automatic wagon tippler will be provided within the internal rail network of the British Steel Corporation's Spencer Works at Llanwern. The signalling will be as shown on the attached sketch.

A new 6-lever ground frame to be known as LLANWERN WEST G.F. will be provided to operate the existing connections and facing point locks "X" and a new connection and facing point lock "Y". The Groundframe will be released by an Annetts key electrically controlled from Llanwern Spencer Works Signalbox, but the electrical control will not be installed until 9/6/74.

A new 2-lever Groundframe to be known as LLANWERN TIPPLER GROUNDFRAME will be provided to operate points and facing point lock marked "Z".

All other connections and signals within the new Sidings will be controlled by the Ore Tippler Controller. The connections will be power operated by the Westinghouse Brake & Signal Company's style 63 machines and emergency crank handles will be kept in the Ore Tippler Control Room.

The existing 2-lever groundframes working the connections "X" will be recovered.

A telephone circuit will be provided, giving communication between the following locations:-

Chief Signalling Inspector, Cardiff and Area Manager, to make all arrangements for safe working including the appointment of the necessary Hand Signalmen in accordance with Section 'E' of the Rule Book.
