Between 08.00 Hrs and 10.00 Hrs on Sunday, 4th May, or until completion, the Divisional Signal and Telecommunications Engineer will be engaged in carrying out the following work :

In connection with the provision of platform 4B at Reading Station, new signals R381 and R332 will be brought into use as shown on sketch.

The existing signal R332 will be recovered, the new signal R332 will be 6 yds nearer to Reading Station, 12 ft to Red aspect.

The new connection will be operated by electric point machine of the S.G.E. style H.B. manufacture, emergency operating instructions for which have been issued separately.

Occupation of the signalling panel at Reading will be required for the purpose of altering and testing the interlocking.

All arrangements for the safe working of the line, together with the appointment of any Handsignalmen required in accordance with Section E of the Rule Book, will be made by the District Operating Inspector.




