A new layout together with associated signalling will be brought into use as shown in heavy type on the attached diagram.

The one lever "Waunllwyd North Ground Frame" will be replaced by a new 8 lever ground frame which will operate connections and shunting lights marked "X". This ground frame will be under the control of the Local Supervisor.

The 3 lever Waunllwyd South Ground Frame will be replaced by a new 5 lever ground frame which will operate a new catchpoint together with the existing connections and the route marked "Y" on Signal UM17, and will be released by Annetts Key controlled electrically from Aberbeeg Junction signal box.

During the occupation, the signal affected viz UM17 will be disconnected and maintained at danger.

Chief Signalling Inspector, Cardiff and Area Manager to make all arrangements for safe working including the appointment of the necessary Hand Signalmen in accordate with Section "E" of the Rule Book.
