Between 08.00 hours and 18.00 hours on Thursday 12th April 1979, or until completion, the Divisional Civil, and Signal & Telecommunications Engineers will be engaged in carrying out the following work:-

The existing Down Goods to Down Main connection at the Westbury end of the Down Goods Loop will be recovered and a new connection provided at approximately 79m 30ch.

A ground position light R.469 will be provided on the Up side of the Down Main at the trailing points in the Down Main of the new Down Goods to Down Main connection. This signal will be routed back along the Down Main to signal R.471 or to Down Goods Loop, towards signal R.473.

The subsidiary signal on the Down Goods Loop to Down Main signal R.884 will be brought into use - Draw ahead to Down Main.

The new connection will be motor-worked from Reading Panel by H.W. type point machines. Emergency operating instructions for these machines have been issued in booklet BR.13108.

A hand crank release instrument for the emergency operation of these points is provided on the Down side of the line at 79m 31ch. The hand crank can only be withdrawn when released from Reading Panel. An automatic telephone will be available at the hand crank site giving communication to Reading Panel. (5128).

All arrangements for the safe working of the line, together with the appointment of any Handsignalmen required in accordance with Section E of the Rule Book will be made by the Area Manager, Reading.
