SWINDON - WOOTTON BASSETT

ON SATURDAY & SUNDAY 6 & 7 DECEMBER, 1980 AND SATURDAY & SUNDAY 14 & 14 DECEMBER, 1980

Between 22.30 on Saturday 6 December and 10.30 on Sunday 7 December 1980 signals and A.W.S. inductors associated with reversible signalling over the Up Main will be commissioned in readiness for future use as follows: -

A.W.S. inductor for SN662 and SN.662R signal and Routes to "Down and Up Main" from platform signals SN.42, SN.44, SN.46 and SN.48.

Between 22.30 on Saturday 13 December and 06.00 on Sunday 14 December, 1980 signals and A.W.S. inductors associated with reversible signalling over the Down Main will be commissioned and in readiness for future use as follows:

Routes to "Up and Down Main" from SN.45, SN.141, SN.645 and SN.645R, SN.653, SN.741 SN.653R and their associated A.W.S. inductors, together with routes from SN.659 to Platforms 1, 3 and Up main and its associated A.W.S. inductor.

The facing crossovers at Wootton Bassett West and Wootton Bassett East shown in heavy type on the diagram overleaf will be made available for use.

All new A.W.S. inductors are also shown in heavy type on the diagram.
