## READING PANEL - MORETON CUTTING SATURDAY 13 SEPTEMBER TO MONDAY 15 SEPTEMBER

Between 22.30 hours on Saturday 13 September and 18.00 hours on Monday 15 September or until completion, the Divisional Signals and Telecommunications Engineer will be carrying out the following work:-

The junction at Moreton Cutting will be re-modelled and the signalling altered as shown in heavy print on the attached diagram.

Existing signal R17 will have the capacity to display a single flashing yellow aspect for movement to the Up Relief.

All the new connections will be worked by clamplocks controlled from Reading Panel. Special instructions for the emergency operation of rail clamp locks have been issued separately.

Occupation of the Panel will be required for the purpose of altering and testing the interlocking.

During the occupation the signals affected, Viz:-

R70, R170, R19, R119, R17, will be disconnected and maintained at "danger".

All arrangements for the safe working of the line, including the appointment of any Handsignalmen should be made by the Area Manager, Reading.
