PORT TALBOT - ALTERATIONS TO LAYOUT AT JERSEY MARINE SOUTH JUNCTION

Between the hours of 06.00 Saturday, 16 February, 1980, and 18.00 Friday, 22 February, 1980, or until completion, new connections will be introduced and signalling modified as shown on the attached diagram. This work is being carried out in association with the Civil Engineers relaying and remodelling at Jersey Marine South Junction.

All connections will be worked by clamp locks from Port Talbot Panel. Special instructions for the emergency operation of Rail Clamp Locks have been issued separately.

Track circuits will be altered accordingly.

One additional shunt route from PT.568 over the new crossover to the Down VON will be brought into use. The route from PT.466 to the Down VON line will now be via PT.568 which acts as a facing shunt in the route.

Occupation of the Port Talbot Panel will be required for alterations and testing the interlocking.

During the occupation the signals affected, viz. PT.451, PT.466, PT.468, PT.470, PT.566, PT.568, PT.587 will be disconnected and maintained at red.
