North East Junction Signal Box will be closed and all its B.R. signalling equipment recovered.

The track layout will be altered and the remaining connections converted to hand operation as shown on the diagram overleaf. Connections not used will be spiked, clipped and padlocked set for normal running pending recovery and replacement with plain line.

The train movements in this area will be under the control of the Dock Controller.
