New and amended signalling will be progressively brought into use as shown on the attached sketch.

During the occupation all signals and points in the Up Yard will be disconnected as required, and the points will be worked by hand and handsignalling will apply.

Movements into the yard will be controlled by handsignalmen stationed at signals R.802 and R.887 (signal R.887 will be controlled from Reading panel for Up Main trains).

Movements from the yard will be controlled from Reading Panel by signals R.806 and R.893.

Occupation of Reading Panel will be required for the purpose of testing.

All arrangements for the safe working of the line, including the appointment of any Handsignalmen should be made by the Area Manager, Reading.
