

PORT TALBOT - MARGAM MOORS

Between 22.00 hours on Saturday 29 August 1981 and 17.00 hours on Wednesday 2 September or until completion a new layout will be brought into use and signalling altered as shown in heavy type on the attached diagram.

The former Up Goods Loop and No. 4 Siding will be recovered and Sidings Nos. 1, 2 and 3 will become the new Up Goods Loop, No. 1 Siding and No. 2 Siding respectively.

Stencil Indicators 'S3' and 'S4' will be recovered from signal PT31, PT8 and PT 614.

(N.B. The facing connection from the Up Main to the Up Goods Loop, the trailing connection from the Up Goods Loop to the Up Main and the Up and Down Main facing crossover will be operated by electro hydraulic clamp locks).


