THEALE RECEPTION SIDINGS

From 0001 Saturday 13 April, S&T and Civil Engineering staff will be carrying out the following work, which will be brought into use with effect from 0500 Monday 15 April 1991 (or completion). Please refer also to the diagram on the back of this Notice.

The mechanical lever ground frame will be abolished. A new power- worked ground switch panel, released electrically from Reading signal box, will be provided. It will control the points and slotted signal routes shown on the diagram.

The connection marked 1A- 1B in bold line, previously laid in and secured, will be brought into use. An additional route will be provided from signal R. 499, reading over this new connection towards the No.2 Reception line.

A new position light signal (numbered R. 468) will be provided on the No.l Reception line to the Reading side of existing connection marked 3A-3B, facing Down direction movements. Routes will be available from R. 468 along the No.l Reception line or to the sidings as indicated.

An illuminated board, worded "Stop- Await Instructions" will be provided on the No.2 Reception line as shown, facing Down direction movements, alongside new signal R. 468 referred to above.

New "Stop- Await Instructions" boards (non- illuminated) will be provided at the exits from the ARC Sidings and the C.M.C./ Cripple Sidings as shown.
