From 0001 Saturday 11 May 1991, S&T and Civil Engineers staff will be carrying out work detailed below to provide new run round facilities, which will be brought into use with effect from 0500 WEDNESDAY 14 MAY 1991 (or completion). Please refer also to the diagram on the back of this Notice.

- 1. New signals will be provided, giving routes as follows:-
- R.466 (a) along Up Westbury in Down direction towards new R.476 (b) along Down/ Up Goods in Down direction towards R.802
- R.476 (a) through crossover and along Down Westbury towards R. 808 (stencil "D" displayed)
 - (b) along Up Westbury in Down direction towards new LOS signal R.478 (stencil "U" displayed)
- R.478 Up Westbury (Down direction) Limit of Shunt; permanently displays two red lights horizontally
- 2. Existing signals will be altered as follows:-
- R.893 new position light aspect applying along Up Westbury towards R. 895
- R.806 new position light aspect applying along Up Westbury in Down direction towards new LOS signal R.478
- R.887 new stencil indicator, which will display the letter "G" for the existing position light route towards the Goods line. A new position light route will be added, applying along the Up Westbury towards R.895, for which a stencil letter "U" will be displayed.


