## Alteration of Signals at Swindon "D" Box.

---

**SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 20th, 1904.**

---

Commencing at 6.0 a.m., the Signal Engineer will move the Down Platform Line to Main Starting, and Down Platform Line to Branch Starting Signals (on same post) 35 yards farther from the Box, and the Down Main Starting Signal 47 yards farther from the Box.

These Signals are all slotted from "E" Box.

During the time the work is being carried out, Distant Signals Nos. 1 in "D" Box and 2 in "E" Box will be disconnected and placed at danger.

### WHITE LIGHTS IN GROUND DISCS, SIDING AND BACKING SIGNALS IN PLACE OF RED LIGHTS.

This alteration will be made as under:—

**November 22nd.**—Clevedon, Congresbury, Sandford and Banwell and Winscombe.

**November 23rd.**—Cheddar and Draycott.

**November 24th.**—Wookey ground frame and station, Wells (Tucker Street), East Somerset and ground frame.

The work will be commenced at 10 a.m. each day.

District Inspectors to make the necessary arrangements in accordance with Rule 71.
