On Sunday, 7th June, 1942, between the hours of 7.0 a.m. and 5.0 p.m. or until the work is completed, the Signal Engineer will be engaged in bringing into use a new signal box situated on the Up side of the Up Main Line approximately 12 yards west of Marston Crossing to be known as "Marston Crossing West."
